## **Longmont Community Foundation Impact**

### **Immigrant Legal Center of Boulder County**

We are a non-profit immigration law firm and, naturally, there is a great demand for our services. We interface each day with the U.S. Department of Homeland Security and U.S. Department of State on behalf of our clients. This puts us in a serious mood. Some might call us grumpy; but who



wouldn't be grumpy if they spent their day struggling with DHS? Regardless, we don't get involved in social media because we just don't have the time. But video presentations are the preferred method for potential

funders to learn about non-profit organizations. This past January, specifically on Friday the 13th, The Foundation did a presentation and we instantly saw that we COULD enter the current decade! With the Foundation's help we were able to submit an online staff meeting as our video, and we have already been twice successful! Our greatest thanks to the Longmont Community Foundation for helping us earn the funds that we need in order to best serve the community.

## Wild Plum Center for Young Children and Families

Through our journey with the Longmont Community Foundation, we have been able to provide our teaching staff with basic supplies for their classrooms and families

with resources and materials for support. We have been fortunate to be recipients of many grants that have allowed us to serve our community in ways that we couldn't have



imagined. The families we serve have shared their desire for longer hours of provided childcare and a Friday care option for our preschool students. These are all feasible options that we are looking forward to implementing in our classrooms. Wild Plum Center has been a recipient and participant of many grants, giving circles, and other various opportunities through the Longmont Community Foundation and that makes it possible to meet the needs of children and families.

### Growing Gardens of Boulder County, Inc.

This year we were not eligible to apply to the Live and Give Fund, as it is now prioritizing smaller organizations for that fund. We were, however, eligible to apply to funds that LCF manages, including the Left Hand Giving Circle, AMD, and MASCO grant programs. We were thrilled to receive funding from all three programs this year, and this unexpected support has helped us to continue to grow our programs to better support more members of the Longmont area community, including better meeting Latino families' needs through Family Farm programs.

This support is critical this year especially. Last fall, 60% of the Longmont Food Project Farm's growing space was repurposed to build a turf athletic field. We are very supportive of the YMCA's mission to provide athletic opportunities for children living on low incomes in

Longmont, and are working closely with the Y to reconfigure the farm to make the best use of the remaining space. Our overall growing space will, however, be significantly reduced.

This additional funding will help us meet community



needs as we build a new farm in partnership with Bethlehem Lutheran Church. This new growing space enables us to continue donating 10,000 of pounds of food annually to support needs in Longmont, through the OUR Center, Timberline PK-8th school, Wild Plum Preschool, and the I Have A Dream Foundation. We are also excited for this new venture, and the opportunities to provide garden-based science, environmental, and nutrition education to youth in the Longmont area. ## **Longmont Community Foundation Impact Continued**

### The Reentry Initiative

Longmont Community Foundation has been with The Reentry Initiative since the beginning. In 2015, Longmont local Deborah Simmons noticed a gap in services for people reentering the community after incarceration. Hence, The Reentry Initiative (TRI) was founded.

The Longmont Community foundation has been crucial to our growth. As a nascent organization, TRI was able to raise visibility through the LCF. There have been multiple opportunities to engage with donors, submit social marketing materials, and apply for grants. Over the years, TRI has been the recipient of the Live and Give Grant, The LeftHand Giving Circle and many DAFs.

Last year, TRI was evaluating new programs for parenting skills when we found 'Parenting Inside Out', a curriculum



developed specifically for our population that helps parents rebuild their relationships with their children in a safe environment. The curriculum uses role playing, various modalities of arts and crafts, individual and group reflections and discussions to enhance parents abilities to

help their children grow into healthy adults. A DAF through LCF was able to step in and provide funding to purchase the curriculum and offset staff time to get trained on the program.

The first parenting group with this curriculum started in January 2023. A variety of individuals and partners are attending for different reasons. Some have to attend as a condition of their parole. Some want to attend so they can regain custody of their children. All are in agreement they are changing the way they approach parenting. Many of the men report the art activities and discussions are rooted in trauma informed principles which allows them safety in participating and being open about their feelings.

This curriculum is enhancing our community by bringing families back together who were separated due to the justice system. Thank you to the LCF DAF that helped us get there.

### Cultivate

Longmont Community Foundation has impacted Cultivate through their ongoing financial support and letting people in the community know about the no-cost services we provide to seniors in the community. One of our programs, Carry-Out-Caravan, provides weekly grocery shopping and delivery. Once a week, clients can place their orders with a volunteer order taker, then our volunteers personally shop that order and it is delivered right through the client's door!

The Longmont Community Foundation funds helped support the purchase of new, reusable freezer grocery bags that allow us to deliver these groceries to seniors in the area. Quality bags are important



to ensure that frozen and cold foods are delivered at the proper temperature and to withstand the weekly shuffle of grocery deliveries and keep disposable bags out of the landfill. Replacing worn out bags is a necessary expense of this program that has been directly supported by the Longmont Community Foundation!

### **Recovery Café Longmont**

We are deeply grateful for Longmont Community Foundation's support of our work! Thanks to your generosity,

Recovery Café Longmont has been able to continue offering our recovery services, expand outreach to the Spanish-speaking community, and help members access a wide array of services, including emergency shelter and basic needs support, employment,



housing, and mental health and treatment services.

## **Longmont Community Foundation Impact Continued**

### **Eco-Cycle**

As Eco-Cycle's Green Star Schools (GSS) program has grown over the past decade, the Longmont Community Foundation



has been a great source of support in both grants directly from the Foundation and in facilitating additional gifts from individuals and businesses in the Longmont community.

The GSS program makes Zero Waste an integral part of the daily school routine for students and teachers in Boulder County schools, aiming

to change student behavior and reduce school waste through environmental education, field trips, and resource conservation, recycling, and composting. There are currently 13 Longmont schools enrolled in our GSS program, serving over 6,000 students. An additional 11 schools with over 5,000 students have access to our environmental education programs.

We are currently working to make our environmental education field trips accessible to more students in Longmont, particularly those enrolled in lower income schools. Experiential learning through field trips helps students understand how their decisions affect the environment, connects them to the outdoors, and builds links between concepts like compost, soil health, and healthy food.

Longmont Community Foundation has helped facilitate the donation of seed money for this program, and we look forward to expanding our reach with support from more members of the community.

On a more personal note, as someone new to the Boulder County community, I've found Eric (Hozempa) to be a wonderful support as I navigate my new position and build relationships. What a great resource for the community!

### CALMING KIDS(CK): Creating a Non-Violent World

In 2019, CALMING KIDS (CK): Creating a Non-Violent World was blessed to receive a \$7500 grant from the Left Hand Giving Circle under the Longmont Community Foundation. Since 2004, CK has been instructing students of all ages, school staff, families and youth professionals with mental health techniques to decrease violent behavior and help with self-regulation strategies.

The funding we received from the Community Projects impacted early childhood education. This generous funding allowed the Calming Kids team of teachers to provide movement, mindfulness, self-regulation and relaxation practices for Pre-school thru 2nd grade students within the St. Vrain Valley school district. Our team of teachers impacted 17 schools along the front range that year. This funding allowed CK to share calming techniques and coping skills with students of all abilities and to provide hard copy books

for home use. The timing could not have been more appropriate due to schools closing and students becoming quarantined at home as the world went into isolation in spring of 2020. Our



positive influence became evident when teachers and schools complimented the educational impact we had during the pandemic. Their students and staff had a tool box of strategies and supplies to help them concentrate and regulate during that period of home learning. The CK curriculum offers skills that last a lifetime in all situations. The Left Hand Giving Circle and the Longmont Community Foundation gave Calming Kids a fantastic opportunity to shine our light above and beyond!





# **Scholarship Update**

In 2023, the Longmont Community Foundation awarded over \$200,000 in scholarships to 53 students. \$140,000 of this is in new scholarships and \$60,000 are scholarships that are being renewed. This is a remarkable testimony to the generosity of our community. Of our 53 students, 7 are first generation, 3 are pursuing trade or vocational fields and 16 are in college.

New scholarships that were awarded for the first time were the Braly Geneva UNC Teaching Scholarship, The Davies Scholarship and the Fred Litzenberger Basketball Camp Award. Due to the continued generosity of many Longmont-area donors we awarded seven new Ascend St. Vrain Scholarships and renewed nine Ascend St Vrain Scholarships. ## Renewable Scholarships

Renewable scholarships are not guaranteed, nor automatic, and certain criteria and standards must be met to renew such as maintaining a certain GPA, taking a certain course load, and using the funds only for allowable expenses. If a recipient continues to meet those set criteria, after the initial award, the scholarship continues to be awarded. It helps students manage the yearly education costs for the duration of their degree program.

Why should donors support the Ascend St Vrain Scholarship or create their own renewable scholarship program through the Longmont Community Foundation? Here is some data reported by our past recipients in a survey we conducted.

**67%** reported they had more opportunities as a high school senior for scholarships than once in college.

**34%** reported their scholarship awards decreased after their freshman year due to many of their scholarships being one-time awards.

**1** student reported of her 8 scholarships received as a high school senior only 2 were renewable.

**75%** reported that they would graduate with some form of debt.

Applicants reported receiving renewable scholarships offered them the opportunity to focus on completing their education with less financial stress / burden.
